Since publication off my article in the Blog on the York Penny Conundrum a new specimen came to light in the Facebook group 'English Hammered and Early Milled Coin Collectors' posted by L. Jovaisa and has subsequently come into my possession. The coin is from the York Local die Mullet and Lis obverse and is muled with a Rosette Mascle York reverse. Prior to this the only other mule recorded was with a Rosette Mascle obverse and a Mullet and Lis reverse (British Museum).

Obverse reads -

+HENRICVS REX ANGLIE  
Plain Cross initial mark, Mullet and Lis by crown

Reverse reads -

CIVI / ♦TAS / ♣EBO / RACI  
Mascle before TAS, Rosette before EBO

This coin adds further weight to the re-assigning of the Mullet and Lis coins to the 1430 period.
